

Center for International Indigenous Affairs Bylaws

Amended and Approved by the College Faculty Meeting (May 5, 2014)

Approved by the College Faculty Meeting (April 27, 2018)

- I. To promote international indigenous research collaboration, raise concerns for international indigenous affairs, expand student students' perspective and achieve the aims of building international academic, education and cultural collaboration, the College of Indigenous Studies (CIS) at NDHU founded the Center for International Indigenous Affairs (CIIA). The establishment of CIIA is based on existing regulation of the NDHU Foreign Affairs Committee to institute International Affairs Center at the College level.
- II. The responsibility of CIIA is as follows:
 - a. Design or implement international exchanges on indigenous academic, educational and cultural affairs.
 - b. Investigate in policies and strategies for international affairs of CIS.
 - c. Establish program and evaluation for international student recruitment, guidance and scholarship for the NDHU.
 - d. Facilitate the promotion of NDHU international exchange programs.
- III. Members of CIIA include:
 - a. A Director that overseeing the operation of the Center. The Director must be an Associate Professor or Professor, approved by the Dean of CIS. Each term of service is three years and term can be extended.
 - b. If appropriate, CIIA is permitted to establish task force teams for particular missions or employ consultation.
 - c. Full-time or part-time staffs for projects and missions.
- IV. Funding of CIIA comes from applying for relevant grants or fundraising.
- V. CIIA hosts annual international exchange and consultation meetings.
- VI. This Charter will be implemented after the Faculty Meeting at CIS, same procedure applies to any amendments of the Charter.
